

Philip preaches the Word Acts 8:1-40

Philip knew enough to move over to the side, and as he did he noticed the man was reading from a scroll.




Philip jogged along beside the chariot. "Do you understand what you're reading?"

Questions

Younger Kids

- 2. What did Simon the Mage want? Why was Peter mad at this request?
- 3. What was Beranhu's response to Philip's lesson?

Middle Kids

- 1. Read Acts 8:3-5. What happened because of Stephen's death? Can you think of something that was bad that also had a good result?
- 2. Read Acts 8:16-17. What did Simon want? Why did he want it? Did he want it for the right reasons?
- 3. Read Acts 8:30-31. Why couldn't the eunuch understand what he was reading? How are we able to understand scripture?

Older Guys

1. Acts 8:1 and 3-5. How did God use Stephen's death and the persecution of the church?

- 2. Read Acts 8:9. Can you have power without God? How do you think Simon was working his magic?
- 3. Read Acts 8:9. What other examples can you think of people using god for profit? Have you ever tried to use God for profit or like a good luck charm?

Activities

1. Use a Venn diagram and compare Simon the Mage and his reactions to the Ethiopians reactions. How are they the same and how are they different?
